January Meeting 2022

### Enrollment

Total currently enrolled: 335 following the Holidays (increase of 4 students)

The second FTE (Full Time Enrollment) count will be March 2022.

### SCSC annual Audit

This was a virtual audit conducted by the assistant legal advisor to the SCSC. The result of these meetings will be compiled into a letter which will arrive on January 31<sup>st</sup> 2022. We have not received any reply as of this date.

### New System for Registering Fire Drills

Website charges to the Fire Marshall and State Insurance Investigator website went into effect this month. We have updated our information and run a test on the system. System seems to be operational.

**Preliminary look at Teacher Salary Sheet for 2022/2023** A copy of the new teacher salary sheet for 2022-2023 is attached. The number on the right is a comparison of the Odyssey pay scale in comparison to the Coweta County pay scale.

### School Bus Safety Video

Our scholars are creating a school bus video for a safety presentation for our parents and the community. We will show the video to the board when available.

### Concussion Protocol Meeting

During our annual SCSC audit, it was brought to our attention that we need to have two meetings related to house bills that effect athletics. When we stated “we have no athletics and have not had any athletics since March of 2020”, the SCSC stated “There is no available exception for these presentations”. On December 1<sup>st</sup> we presented two meetings:

(1) **Concussion protocol as detailed by - § 20-2-324.1. Concussion** management and return to play policies for youth athletes.

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(2) Sudden Heart Attack – “Inform students participating in interscholastic athletic activities about the nature and warning signs of sudden cardiac arrest”.

## **Academics**

Note: The SCSC has confirmed that 2020-2021 Milestone scores will be used to calculate the academic efficiency of charter renewal in 2025.

Report Cards for the first semester are compiled the week of Jan 10<sup>th</sup> and sent out to parents.

## **Learning Loss**

The two 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade math teachers were trained in November, in the use of the remediation program MATH 180. This is a specific, self-paced program for scholars who have a math deficit or “Lost Learning” specific to their grade level. These classes are assigned and are scheduled. We are currently reviewing new math curriculums as our current program will expire next year.

## **Staff Status**

Our teaching positions for this year are filled. A licensed teacher is in each classroom. One of the state audits in October counts licensed teachers on campus, and we will be complete in this regard.

## **CoViD19**

SARS-V2 continues to infect residence of Coweta County with the CoViD-19.

The Omnicron variant still appears to be the greatest threat to the safety of our scholars and families. The CDC issued new guidelines for asymptomatic scholars who were exposed and/ or begin to show symptoms. 5 days quarantine when exposed to a positive individual. If symptoms become evident during this time, 10 day quarantine with a negative test result are required before any adult or scholar may return to class.

January 10<sup>th</sup> – Fifth grade teacher tested positive and fifth grade classes were quarantined for 5 days to watch for symptoms. One first grade class was quarantined when the teacher tested positive. On January 17<sup>th</sup> (Monday evening) we were informed a Kindergarten scholar had tested positive and the class had to be quarantined the next day and until Thursday. In the meantime, two intervention teachers who work with that class both tested positive.
