### Enrollment

Total currently enrolled for year 2022/2023 is 338 scholars. Classes are starting on time and running smoothly. Enrollment Count due in March 2023.

### Staff Status

We had two paraprofessionals leave to explore career options.

### Sports Status

Basket Ball has started its season with a boys and girls game at Flint River Academy. The Boys Team won their first Game and the girls lost in a close battle. The second and third Games were canceled due to student illness and a gas leak at one school. There are 21 games on this year's schedule. Boys (A and B teams) and girls play at the same location on the same days. I will send out an update with our YTD standings.

### Scholar Issue During the School Day

A young man made a verbal threat to his classmates and teacher during science class. The scholar was isolated while the threat was investigated. No evidence was discovered that would indicate that the threat was real. Scholar was suspended for a level 4 discipline violation. A letter was sent to parents informing them of the issue.

### Charter Obligations

During the monthly meeting of the State Charter School Commission (SCSC) the state charter schools were listed on a performance matrix. Our current numbers are within acceptable ranges in our financial measurements:

Current assets divided by current liabilities	Exceeds Standard – 14.29 (1.0 to 3.0 Meets)

Efficiency Margin	Exceeds Standard - 172% (10% or Greater)

### **Professional Develop**

On January 2 (a teacher work day) a “Gun shot on campus” demonstration was held for the staff. The exercise will consist of fire arm simulation in a sequence of:

1 single shot, 1 1 double shots, 1 1 1 three shots in suggestion. Each exercise will be done in five areas about the building so the staff can hear:

1. A close shot to their room
2. A shot from several halls away
3. A shot from the opposite side of the building

This exposure to the sound of gunfire was suggested by both the FBI and Department of Homeland Security in multiple presentations. We debriefed as a staff at 10:00 following the exercise.

**State Health Insurance Program**

We have received notice that we are accepted in the State Health Benefit Plan (SHBP) Blue Cross Health Program with enrollment dates of Dec 1<sup>st</sup> through the January 1<sup>st</sup> 2023. This is the same program public schools and state employees are on. This health program remains available to teachers who retire in the state of Georgia. The difference in cost for an employee with family coverage is:
