Charter Renewal

At the February 2025 SCSC Board of Directors meeting, a 3 year conditional Charter was granted by unanimous vote. If test scores of the 2015/2016 school year are on projection, the Charter will automatically rollover to a 5 year contract at that time.

Lottery Complete

Lottery for those grades with a waiting list occurred on March 4th at 6:00pm. Lottery was live at the school and results posted the next day on the school website. Parents who were successful in the lottery were contacted by the registrar within 24 hours.

Flue and Attendance

Numberous school districts in the area are experiencing high rates of illness due to the flue conditions. 10 states have had entire districts closed due to high rates of absenteeism. Polk County (all schools), west of Cobb County, closed for 3 days to sanitize. We are watching these numbers closely. Part of the reason for the winter break being in the middle of February is to break up the influenza which occurs each year.

Teachers are sanitizing their rooms at the end of each school day. Hand sanitizer is in every room and scholars are required to utilize hand sanitizing whenever they leave the room and when they re-enter the room.

Texas continues to experience outbreaks of measles with one death of a six year old thus far. We are watching this closely.

March Madness Has Begun

Four Saturday's in March are available for tutoring. Grades 5 and 8 come in on Saturdays for specific tutoring in Math and ELA while 3rd grade has a tutoring period during the school day.
