### **Enrollment**

Total currently enrolled for year 2022/2023 is 338 scholars. Classes are starting on time and running smoothly. Enrollment entered in GaDoe system. Missed the SCSC 2% projection requirement by 1 scholar.

### **Test Scores**

### **Annual Audit Report (DE 46)**

This year's financial audit has been submitted on time

The entire financial report was registered with the SCSC as required by Georgia statutes.

### **SCSC Monitoring**

The annual monitoring of operations by the SCSC was completed prior to the September 5<sup>th</sup> due date. Several hundred pages of data was requested and entered into the SCSC portal for review. The SCSC will respond in 2023 on their findings.

### **Special Ed. MOE Report**

The MOE report was drafted by our accountant and submitted on time. We did not make Maintenance of Efforts due to decline in enrollment of Sp.Ed. scholars. Report was filed on time but GaDoe did not release data in a timely manner and the deadline was not met.

### **Georgia District Flexibility and Charter School Division**

The annual report for the District Flexibility and Charter School Division opened on October 4<sup>th</sup> due by November 1<sup>st</sup>. We made our submission on October 5<sup>th</sup>. This is a scaled down version of the SCSC annual Monitoring and requested similar information and document.

### **Staff Status**

We started the school year with a licensed teacher in every classroom. We are still looking for 1 paraprofessionals for classroom support in grades K – 5<sup>th</sup> as Ms. Moss will be leaving in January 2023.

### **Sports Status**

Girls volley ball completed their first post Covid season. While they only won one round (3 game set) out of the 6 scheduled events, it came during a tournament so everyone got to play all day and they were competitive. We are now starting the Basketball season.

### **Charter Obligations**

During the monthly meeting of the State Charter School Commission (SCSC) the state charter schools were listed on a performance matrix. Our current numbers are within acceptable ranges in our financial measurements:

## **QBE Funding for 2022**

September QBE allotment was = \$331,485.00. We should expect this to remain consistent. The October Student Count was 338. We will be watching to see how this effects our monthly income in November.

We have had no local accounts of cyber bullying that we are aware of or TIK TOK Challenges that affect our scholars.

## **School Drills**

The first security drills were reported for August, September and October:

Fire Drill -	Oct 3 <sup>rd</sup> (Construction Dust)

Preliminary contact with Sherriff Department regarding staff training. We will continue discussion on this as the school year develops. We are looking at January 2 (a teacher work day) to execute a “Gun shot on campus “demonstration.

New Fire drill process tested and appears to be working. Scholars go on hold during a fire drill. The office releases the scholars and staff when it is safe to egress.
