Student Outcomes

We continue to institute a school wide book study utilizing "Wonder", a novel about a student who was home schooled until 5th grade due to a facial deformity. The story details a perspective on bullying and understanding at a level grades 4th-8th can relate to. The novel has been used to teach tolerance and understanding by European and American educators since its publication in 2012. The novel has been on the Amazon best 100 read list and is supported by the National Association of Secondary School Principals. We will be attending the movie version of the book tomorrow.

Tutoring has started for grades K-2. This year we are measuring pre-tutor data using the GRASP program developed by Georgia RESA. Students who are weak in math are assigned to a math class, students weak in reading are attending a reading class. Post test data will be collected following the course at the end of February. Pre and post test data will be reviewed and annualized for next year's planning. "March Madness" for grades 3-8 will be utilized again this year. More to follow on March Tutoring programs.

The last period of the day has been dedicated to specific subject related class activities. A journalism club, Math Team, Science team, debate team, and club specific activities are scheduled during the last period of the day to help improve the "Application of Learning". The "Mathletes" are already scheduling inner school competition for grades 6 thru 8th in show-down math. They would like to invite other schools from the area to compete later this year. The "Eye of the Tigers," our first school newspaper, was published this month. Students in journalism enrichment class all authored articles and published photos as well as interviews with teachers and administrators.
